CONTRACT

Between

Montana Columbia Sheep Breeders' Association (Association) And Recipient of the Starter Flock (Recipient)

- 1. Conditions specified within this document must be complied with. If situations arise which are not clarified in this Contract, Recipient and Association must work together to achieve a solution. Association's decision will be final.
- 2. The Association will award a starter flock of 4 open ewes to the Recipient. Recipient will accomplish the following:
 - a. Recipient is responsible for feeding, housing and care of the sheep.
 - b. Recipient must provide sheep with proper nutrition and health care, including vaccinations, medications, worming, hoof trimming and shearing.
 - c. Recipient will be responsible for all costs involved with raising the sheep.
 - d. Registered Columbia rams must be used to breed the brood ewes in the flock during the first 3 years.
- 3. Starter flock ewes' registrations will be transferred to the Recipient.
 - a. Lambs from the starter flock ewes will be inspected and, if qualified, will be registered in the Recipient's name.
- 4. Starter Flock Recipient will be assigned a sponsor/mentor who will be a member of the Association, selected by the Association.
 - a. The flock donor will be the initial sponsor.
 - b. An Association member living near the Recipient may also be designated a sponsor/mentor by the Association. This person is available to answer questions, provide assistance and encouragement.
 - c. The sponsor may visit to inspect the sheep at any time.
 - d. These persons are NOT responsible for the success or failure of the project.
- 5. Recipient should show their breeding stock as a breeding project in the junior/open breeding sheep division at their local county fair and also at the Montana Columbia Junior Show in Lewistown.
- 6. Recipient must maintain membership with the Association during the three-year period.

- 7. Recipient is required to compensate the Association the value of a 100-lb. market lamb each successive year for 3 years. This payment is to be made at the annual Association sale. The proceeds will be used to fund future starter flocks. The value of the market lamb (price /pound) will be the average price paid for 100 lb. Lambs at the sale at Public Auction Yards in Billings, MT just prior to the Annual Columbia Assn. sale in Lewistown.
- 8. Recipient is required to submit a written report to the Association annually for 3 years on the progress of the flock. This report will presented at the General Membership Meeting at Lewistown in conjunction with the Montana Columbia Sheep Show and Sale.
- 9. Failure to comply with conditions in this Contract will cause original starter flock ewes to be returned to the Association.
